# LOGISMED TRAINING ACTIVITIES (LOGISMED-TA)

## OBJECTIVES

The current lack of qualified staff, adequate training programmes and harmonized logistics systems hinders a smooth trade flow in the Mediterranean region. LOGISMED-TA is the training component of the LOGISMED programme, which aims to create a network of Euro- Mediterranean logistics platforms. LOGISMED-TA aims to:

- Increase the qualifications and skills of logistics platforms' operators and managers.
- Improve the performance of the logistics sector in the entire Mediterranean region.
- Contribute to a more competitive and efficient network of Euro-Mediterranean Logistics Platforms.

## BENEFICIARIES

- Logistics staff (e.g. transport regulators, freight forwarders, transport operators, customs and border agencies, etc.)
- National administrations

### LOCATION

First phase:

- Egypt
- Morocco
- Tunisia

Second phase:

- Rest of Southern Mediterranean countries

### DURATION

Second semester of 2013 – end of 2018

### TOTAL COST

€6.6 million

## ACTIONS

- Establish one training unit per platform (addressed to 200-400 staff each).
- Develop national logistics associations and raise awareness among national administrations.
- Create a “train the trainers” programme (15 staff members per platform).
- Establish a group of 100-200 managerial staff per platform

## RESULTS

The project will streamline the flow of trade, increase qualified staff, reduce logistics costs, and contribute to the creation of a regional free trade area.
