## Promoting early screening for cervical and breast cancer is key to save thousands of women's lives in the region

In the Euro-Mediterranean region, approximately 192,000 women die every year because of cervical and breast cancer. Prevention and early screening are critical to prevent this type of cancer and save thousands of women's lives in the region. The Union for the Mediterranean (UfM) and the World Health Organisation (WHO) partner to promote cervical and breast cancer prevention and early screening through the project "Women's Right to Health (WoRTH)".

Ministers from the 43 Member countries of the UfM gathered in Cairo at the 4th UfM Ministerial Conference on "Strengthening the Role of Women in Society". They agreed on a common agenda to strengthen the role of women in the Euro-Mediterranean region. They acknowledged the efforts made by UfM countries to foster gender equality and women's and girls' empowerment and stressed the need to address the obstacles that still hinder the full participation of women in the public and private spheres.





#### A call for action towards a shared Mediterranean Climate Agenda


Keeping the global temperature rise to below 2° C, the target set by the Paris Agreement, calls for a coordinated regional strategy that cannot rely solely on nationally-determined contributions. Climate-resilient infrastructure, and particularly its financing, is fundamental to tackle climate change. In this regard, the UfM Secretariat has commissioned the first regional study on climate finance to provide a clear overview of the funding flows for climate action initiatives in the region.

#### MedCoast4BG - Med Coasts for Blue Growth

The overall aim of the MedCoast4BG project is to analyse and promote the co-evolution of human activities and natural systems in coastal areas particularly or potentially devoted to tourism, taking into consideration the overall principles of sustainable development, climate change effects, and governance tools such as Integrated Coastal Zone Management (ICZM) and Maritime Spatial Planning (MSP).

The conceptual and methodological model elaborated under the EU funded Co-Evolve Interreg Med project concerning mainly EU Mediterranean Coasts, will be further extended to the Southern & Eastern Mediterranean countries involved in the project, taking into account common (at Mediterranean level) but also diverse (at local level) natural, physical and geographic characteristics. This analysis will be complemented by a quantitative evaluation of "tourism sustainability" in selected Pilot Areas on the basis of adequate metrics and tools (e.g. Indicators & Decision Support System).
