SIL 2011 ABSOLUTELY PACKED

 The 14th edition of the International Logistics and Material Handling Exhibition, leader in Spain and Southern Europe, will take place from 5th to 8th June 2012

Barcelona, 10th June 2011. The International Logistics and Material Handling Exhibition closed its thirteenth edition today with a huge success in terms of visitors. Enrique Lacalle, Chairman of the SIL Organizing Committee indicated that "more than 600 participating companies, 100 worldwide innovations, 250 companies' events, 40 % internationality and the maximum representation of the Spanish, Catalan and municipal government back up the success of this edition, which has exceed all expectations". Moreover, Lacalle added "the rise in professional visitors as well as the number of business contacts and turnover achieved proves also that SIL has become again the meeting point of the logistics sector". Once again SIL has strengthened its leadership in Spain and Southern Europe.

The estimated turnover was around **2.000** million Euros despite the current situation.
