Southern and Eastern Mediterranean countries are experiencing rapid grow in their working age populations. Almost 60% of the regional population is today under the age of 30 and the number of young people under the age of 15 is forecasted to increase over 18% by 2020. In the MENA region, 2.8 Million young people enter the labour market each year. Youth employability represents today a fundamental challenge for the entire region. Education, vocational training and inclusive growth are key elements to facilitate access to the labour market.

17.00-18.30 | Panel II: Sustainable development

The Global Sustainable Development Goals adopted in September 2015 set the scale and the ambition of the new universal Agenda until 2030. Great efforts are also being made to reach a new global and fair agreement on climate change at the COP 21 of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) to be held in Paris in December. The Euro-Mediterranean region faces great challenges for building a sustainable future. Discrepancies in economic development levels and living standards have increased in the last few years and intra-regional commercial exchanges remain low. 650 M tons of sewage are discharged annually in the Mediterranean, while 180 M persons still suffer from water scarcity. By 2030, nearly 80% of the population will be concentrated on 10% of the land, energy consumption in Southern and Eastern Mediterranean could go up to 70% and CO2 emissions could double, exacerbating the impacts of climate change in the region.

- In this context, the UfM is taking part of the global efforts by contributing, at a regional scale and through practical action, to sustainable development in the Euro-Mediterranean region. How can we better link regional action with the global agenda?
- How can we unleash the green-circular economy potential of the region?

Despite the clear progress achieved during the last years in closing the gender gap between men and women in the Mediterranean, work still has to be done to further strengthen women's role in the society and access to equal opportunities. Participation of women in economic life shows a rate of 26% of women joining the labour force in the south and east Mediterranean, and 50% in the European Union ; violence against women remain high in euro-Mediterranean countries and women political participation rates are low. It is widely recognised today that gender equality is essential for a sustainable and inclusive economic development and a sustainable peace. Giving women greater and equal opportunities could significantly contribute addressing the current challenges faced by the region.

- How could we improve and maximize the impact of public policies in the field of gender equality and women empowerment? And how to reduce the gap between adopted policies and level of their implementation?
- What are the best mechanisms and levers to improve women's economic participation as a way to ensure a sustainable and inclusive development for the region? How to provide women with the necessary tools to ensure this participation?
