→ About the study

The current study aims to mapping and assessing the existing policies and instruments that facilitate access to employment of graduates and researchers in the Mediterranean region, highlighting how they could support the development of a sustainable economy through innovation and employability, by supporting regional dialogue on the topic (as it reads on the tender). Based on the thorough study, integrating desk research with interviews and focus groups as well as by organising one roundtable in each of the target countries with relevant stakeholders, a set of usable recommendations for the UfM, will be formulated. The aim is to support UfM in analysing and evaluating strategies, policies, programmes, and key projects in three pilot Med countries by assessing their socio-economic impact, gaps, and bottlenecks on innovating the economies and facilitating employment of young graduates, with the ultimate goal of supporting the shift towards sustainability through the triple helix model of innovation. For the purpose of the study, three pilot countries, based on a subregional balance, are the target for the research activities: Italy, Jordan and Tunisia.

The Study is in line:

- With the conclusions set by the Euro-Mediterranean Ministerial Conference on Higher Education and Scientific Research (Cairo, 2007);
- With the Ministerial Declaration of the UfM Employment and Labour Ministers (Cascais, 2019);
- As well as with the recommendations of the Joint Communication "Renewed partnership with the Southern Neighborhood: A new Agenda for the Mediterranean" (2021), supporting skills development and the employability of researchers and students of the region are key priorities of the UfM.
- With the Ministerial Conference on Research and Innovation 2022 (R&I Ministers from the 42 countries of UfM met for the first time to discuss ways to promote scientific cooperation on climate change, renewable energy and health)
- With the UfM Forum on Green Innovation and Careers for Empowering the Mediterranean Youth: Triple Helix in Action, event supported by GIZ, and hosted in the major ESCWA Conference "Arab SMEs Summit: Opportunities Beyond Borders", held in Amman 30 October-1 November 2022

→ The approach of the Study

The Triple Helix Model of Innovation offers a framework that brings together three spheres that traditionally operate separately (university, industry, and government). It theorizes that in a knowledge economy, boundaries between the different spheres are fading and interaction between them – around knowledge exchange and production – flows dynamically in all directions and creates an innovative environment.

→ Objective of the RoundTable

In cooperation with the relevant UfM National Focal Points of the UfM R&I Platform, three roundtables, one per each target country, with at least 25 participants are organised.

The main objectives of the roundtable are the following:

- with the goal of validating the preliminary results achieved in the desk research;
- to validate the results from the interviews and focus groups and;
- provide content and inputs to complement the analysis;
- to eventually add other dimensions of the analysis which did not stem out from the previous work;
- to ensure a further qualitative insight from a carefully selected group of stakeholders (from the stakeholders' map and according to the suggestions of the national steering committee), targeting academics, enterprises, industry and government representatives.

The participants will be asked to share insights, reflections and needs on the topics tackled by the study and to give inputs for the development of the recommendations.

→ Topics to be explored in the RoundTable

According to what stated in the tender document and along with UNIMED proposal, the main goal of the study is to overcome the gaps between academia and business, assessing their impact, collecting information on gaps and potential, and defining useful feedback in partnership with pilot countries.

The roundtable could focus on the selected topics of the current study based on the country needs and future challenges:

- ➤ The complexity of the relationships between youth unemployment, quality of training and the uptake of the green economy;
- ➤ Raising awareness about the importance of sustainable development choices which is constantly growing among the population, thus making sustainable practices an absolute political priority;
- ➤ Three R&I agenda endorsed by the June 2022 Ministerial Declaration: Climate Change, Renewable Energy and Health;
- ➤ Improving the growth of companies operating in the green economy area, both in terms of production, of consultancy and of design capabilities, in order to create the conditions for the increase of the number of green jobs;
- Adapting the training and education systems in the target countries by reviewing curricula and teaching methodologies to match these with new employment opportunities and with the needs of the labour market:
