# MULTI-SITE URBAN REGENERATION PROJECT IN JERICHO

## OBJECTIVES

In order to boost economic development, the UPFI is working with Jericho Municipality to restore strategic installations connected to agricultural activities and tourism, the drivers of the local economy.

The relocation of facilities with a high urban nuisance factor into less residential zones will allow the development of municipal land in the city centre in order to expand public spaces open for all.

These interventions will bring about the revitalisation of those areas, benefiting commercial activities and local economic development.

The Project is one of the projects selected by the Urban Projects Finance Initiative (UPFI), which aims to promote and develop sustainable and innovative urban projects that serve as best practice examples and are potentially replicable.

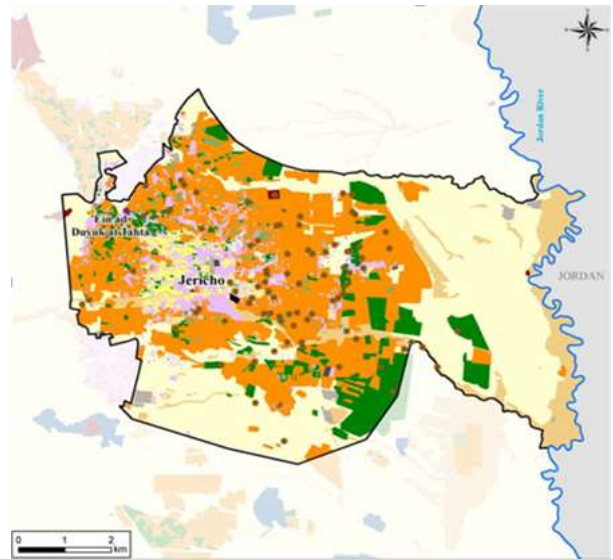


## ACTIONS
