### **Nasser Kamel, UfM Secretary General**



A career diplomat for the Egyptian government, Nasser Kamel held the position of Ambassador of Egypt to the United Kingdom from 2014 to 2018. He was also Ambassador to France in the period 2006-2012, during which he took part in the drafting of the Joint Declaration of the 2008 Paris Summit that marked the launch of the Union for the Mediterranean. Furthermore, between 2012 and 2014, he was Assistant

Minister for Arab and Middle Eastern Affairs. From 2004 to 2006, he was the Director of Egypt's Public Information Service. Prior to this position he served in various embassies, including Washington (1984-1988), Lisbon (1990-1994), Tunis (1994-1998), Brussels (1999-2001) and Paris (2001-2004).

# Johannes Laepple, German Development Cooperation (GIZ)



Johannes Laepple currently heads the GIZ Project "Support to the Union for the Mediterranean (UfM) on Employment and Trade". He has 14 years of combined professional experience in development cooperation, academia and the EU. Angelo Riccaboni is Full Professor of Management Control Systems at the Richard Goodwin School of Economics and Management of the University of Siena. His research focuses on the role of businesses and universities to promote the implementation of United Nations' Agenda 2030 and on innovation in the agrifood sector.

Former Rector of the University of Siena from 2010 to 2016, he is a member of the Leadership Council of the United Nations' Sustainable Development Solutions Network and Chair of the Regional Centre of the SDSN

for the Mediterranean since 2012. Since 2017, he chairs PRIMA Foundation, located in Barcelona to implement a 10-year research and innovation programme on food systems and water resources, with a budget of 500 million euros funded by the European Commission and 19 Euro-Mediterranean Countries.

He chairs the Steering Committee of the Santa Chiara Lab at the University of Siena. He is Member of the Scientific Committee of the World Farmers Organisation (WFO), Member of









the International Academic Committee of the Institute for Sustainable Development Goals of Tsinghua University, Member of the Board of Directors of the University Bicocca in Milan. He is also a Member of the EC sub-group on Mission Area Soil Health and Food of the 'shadow' strategic configuration of the Horizon Europe Programme Committee, Member of the Board of the International Association of Universities (IAU), Head of the IAU Working Group on sustainability, and former Chair of the CRUI Foundation, the operating body of the Association of Italian Rectors.
