	Achieving the objectives of the CBAM and the EUDR (as well as other related regulatory measures with environmental and social ambition) hinges on transparency. Sustainability disclosures can generate transparency about firms' sustainability impacts, risks and opportunities along their supply chains. Thus, sustainability disclosure practices and regulations can lay the foundation for other regulations such as CBAM and the EUDR, which, too, rely on reliable and comparable corporate sustainability information. In that regard, sustainability disclosures and related regulations like the CSRD do not only decrease information asymmetries between firms' and their stakeholders, but also facilitate the implementation of other sustainable finance and trade-related regulations. This session will dive deeper into the interlinkages between the EUDR and CBAM with the sustainable finance framework (such as the Corporate Sustainability Reporting Directive (CSRD) and the EU Taxonomy Regulation). The role of policy coherence as well as international harmonisation of disclosure frameworks will be discussed.
