European Commission High-level Meeting on Science Diplomacy: Science diplomacy for advancing cooperation and dialogue in the Mediterranean

> Science and technology play an increasingly important role in international arena, especially so in the Mediterranean, a sea connecting three continents, and which has served for millennia as an interface between European and Arab Countries. Highly relevant fields for the future of the region call for closer technological and research cooperation, from climate change to energy and health, from food security to the blue economy. This raises the stakes for diplomacy, which needs to be aware and properly informed of challenges and opportunities arising from science and technology. The Mediterranean is demonstrating the positive societal impact of various research initiatives that unite the North, South, and East of the region, including the Partnership for Research and Innovation in the Mediterranean Area (PRIMA), Horizon Europe's Mediterranean Initiative, and the Synchrotron-light for Experimental Science and Applications in the Middle East (SESA-ME), as it was remarked also during the first European Science Diplomacy Conference (Madrid, December 2023).

The Union for the Mediterranean is supporting the development of a scientific agenda in the region with renewed emphasis following the mandate received by its 43 Member States during the UfM Ministerial Conference on Research and Innovation (2022). It has been active in promoting training, research initiatives and acting as a broker between different societal actors, including diplomats, ministries, international organizations, scientists, universities and research centers. In 2024, it launched with the European Commission a Euro-Mediterranean Hub.

The EU is committed to evidence-informed multilateral cooperation and global solidarity. As outlined in the EU's Global Approach to Research and Innovation, a stronger focus on science, technology and innovation in foreign and security policies enables the EU to respond to global challenges, while simultaneously enhancing its resilience and open strategic autonomy. Concurrently, the European Union is developing a European Framework for Science Diplomacy and coordinating a multilateral dialogue on the principles and values of international cooperation in research and innovation, building on its long-standing commitment to academic freedom, research ethics, gender equality, and open science and data. The League of Arab States (LAS) emphasizes the importance of scientific research, highlighted by the COVID-19 pandemic. In collaboration with the Arab League Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (ALECSO), LAS organized seminars on managing disasters and crises. A Scientific Research Strategy was approved in 2017, focusing on social, cultural, and economic dimensions. This led to the development of a General Framework for Arab Scientific Research, approved in 2019, with an executive plan set in 2021.

Building on the 2023 Euro-Mediterranean Conference on Science Diplomacy, co-organised by the Union for the Mediterranean in partnership with the European Commission at the UfM Headquarters in Barcelona, the UfM, the European Commission, and the League of Arab States are partnering to organise jointly a High-level Meeting on Science Diplomacy, as an ideal place to discuss regional cooperation, and how to build concrete initiatives including research infrastructures, mobility and training, and science advice for foreign policy.

#### Structure of the meeting

The meeting is structured in a political and a seminar segment. Invitees include diplomats, directors of research institutes, senior officials in line Ministries (research, foreign affairs, development, environment, etc), and other science diplomacy scholars and practitioners. The goal of the meeting is to present and discuss initiatives on how science, technology and innovation can be transformative engines for dialogue and sectorial cooperation in the Euro-Mediterranean region.

The meeting will be opened with a high-level segment with political/ institutional representatives from the 43 UfM Member States, European Commission, Arab League, and other international organisations. A seminar segment will delve into thematic sessions on selected regional priorities as well as into ways to foster science diplomacy in the Euro-Mediterranean region.

#### **Outcome of the meeting**

Each session is called to produce an outcome in form of document, recommendation, or draft initiative, to be presented at the end of the event.
