UNIMED – Mediterranean Universities Union - and the **Erasmus Student Network** – ESN, with the support of the **University of Palermo** will organise in Palermo the **third Mediterranean Student Summit,** an initiative that seeks to bring together Higher Education students from different backgrounds and from both shores of the Mediterranean to foster intercultural dialogue and work together on common challenges.

After the success of the two first editions, this initiative is now established as an annual event focusing on student engagement and intercultural dialogue with students from **UNIMED Universities**.

The Mediterranean Student Summit: Edition 2024

The third edition of the event will gather at least between **30 and 35 students** from UNIMED member Universities and will take place in the Mediterranean city of Palermo.

This edition will be an opportunity to reflect and encourage the students to explore and invest in their **international dimension**.

If mobility is definitely the key tool to discover, meet other cultures and build up our own international dimension, UNIMED and ESN are also convinced that, on a parallel way, the international dimension can be explored and strengthened "at home", by welcoming and networking with international students, by being part of the international activities implemented by the university, by participating to virtual exchanges, by activating relations with national and international stakeholders.

The Summit will be organised around 3 key moments:

• online training sessions will be provided to selected students to prepare them before the Summit. They will take place in July, August and September 2024 (max 2 per month).

These sessions (before and after) are full part of the Summit and will allow students to be familiar with the objectives of the Mediterranean Student Summit, to be prepared and thus to make the Summit more interactive and instructive. Online sessions will include, among other: ice breaking sessions and intercultural activities; presentation of UNIMED and ESN as well as other regional, national and international stakeholders;

• 3 days-summit in presence in Palermo that includes: presentations by UNIMED, ESN, the University of Palermo and external contributors; presentations by the students (explained in the online sessions and prepared before the Summit), working groups, cultural activities;







• 2 online follow-up meetings after the event to finalise the recommendations and to discuss the outcomes.

These online activities are fully part of the Summit and students should be committed to attend the 3 steps.

The **content** of the event will revolve around five interlinked themes:

- Improving intercultural dialogue and student-led internationalisation in the Mediterranean. Within this theme, the student will discuss topics such as: How can we bring students from different corners of the Mediterranean together? What is the role of the students to establish long-lasting connections that benefit the whole academic community? What are the demands for University leadership and decision makers?
- Improving leadership and networking competencies: the students will discuss the following questions: what kind of spaces exist for me, at my university, to meet others and build competencies? How can I contribute more effectively at student level to the internationalisation of my university? What do I need to get my voice heard at university level and outside university?
- The creation of a Mediterranean Erasmus Generation: how to connect the region through student mobility and international friendship. As part of this block, participants will discuss how we can boost mobility opportunities between the two shores of the Mediterranean, and also within South Mediterranean countries: do we need a new mobility programme? What makes a mobility experience impactful? How can we convince others to take part?
- Building the University of the future in the Mediterranean. In this block, students will discuss which kind of University they would like to see in the future, and which actions are needed to get there.
- Drafting recommendations to make the students' voice heard. Thanks to the preliminary online sessions and the working sessions during the Summit, students will be guided in identifying, defining and writing recommendations on some challenges jointly identified by ESN and UNIMED.
