Shahira Amin (Moderator), Nonresident Senior Fellow, Atlantic Council

Shahira Amin is a nonresident senior fellow at the Atlantic Council's Scowcroft Middle East Security Initiative focusing on Egypt, economics, energy, water access, and women's issues.

She works in Egypt as a freelance journalist who contributes mainly to CNN's Inside Africa and CNN's digital platform. She also writes for Index on Censorship, a portal for free expression. Amin was formerly deputy head of Egyptian state television's English language channel, Nile TV, but she quit at the height of uprising, protesting state television's coverage of the developments in her country. Amin was also formerly a senior anchor and correspondent for the channel.

Amin has traveled the world covering major events and conflicts and has interviewed numerous statesmen and high-profile figures. She has been recognized by UNICEF for her efforts to improve the status of women and children in her country. Earlier this year, she received the American University in Cairo's Catalyst for Change Award and is also a recipient of the Holme of the Year Award from the Gothenburg's Handels- och Sjöfartstidning, connected to University of Gothenburg faculty.

Grammenos Mastrojeni (Co-organizer), Senior Deputy Secretary General, Union for the Mediterranean

Grammenos Mastrojeni is an Italian diplomat, professor and writer who has focused for the past 25 years on the societal, geo-strategic and economic impacts of environmental degradation, as well as on topics related to environmental protection, human cohesion, peace and security. He has taught sustainability and conflict resolution in various universities in Italy and abroad, and in 2009, the Ottawa University in Canada entrusted him with the first class by a University on the issue of Environment, resources and geostrategy.

Formerly, until August 2019, he was the Coordinator for the Environment and Head of the Science-Policy Interface at the Italian Development Cooperation, heading Italian delegations on lands, water and oceans and joining negotiations on climate and biodiversity. Chair of the UN Mountain Partnership, and Co Chair of the Global Islands Partnership, he is President of the largest Italian association for sustainable development education "Isola della Sostenibilità" and member of the Scientific Boards of numerous university courses and entities.









Author of numerous articles and official reports on the environment, he published 8 books including "Greenhouse effect, war effect", written together with the climatologist Antonello Pasini (Chiarelettere, 2017), and "The Ark of Noah – Saving together our Common Home" that ranked as best-selling essays. Among his publications there are also "The indissoluble cycle. Peace, environment, development and freedom in the global balance" (Vita e Pensiero, 2002); "The necessary eco-revolution" (Italian Scientific Editions, 2008); "Now or never. A decade, and not beyond, to save ourselves and the Earth" (Amazon, 2016).

Mahmoud Maged (Co-organizer), Technical Director and Lead Advisor, Regional Center for Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency

Dr. Maged K. Mahmoud is a renowned expert in sustainable energy with nearly 30 years of experience. He currently serves as the Technical Director and Lead Renewable Energy Advisor at RCREEE. Dr. Mahmoud holds a Ph.D. in Mechanical Power Engineering and has worked on various sustainable energy projects in Egypt, Arab, and Mediterranean regions.

He has played a pivotal role in shaping energy strategies, mobilizing funds, and fostering regional cooperation on sustainable energy. Dr. Mahmoud has contributed to over 80 projects, initiatives, and studies, including developing sustainable energy master plans and implementing mechanisms to enhance private sector participation. He has also been instrumental in mobilizing billions of dollars for renewable energy projects and fostering regional cooperation. He has made significant contributions to the advancement of sustainable energy initiatives endorsed by the Arab Ministerial Council of Electricity.

Prior to joining RCREEE, Dr. Mahmoud worked as an official in the Egyptian New and Renewable Energy Authority, where he contributed to setting renewable energy strategies and implementing renewable energy projects. He is a member of several prestigious committees and has authored/co-authored over 50 publications. Dr. Mahmoud is an adjunct lecturer at the British University in Egypt and the Arab Academy for Science, Technology and Maritime Transport, and a certified trainer in energy and management. His extensive experience and contributions have made him a leading figure in sustainable energy, driving advancements in sustainable energy policies and projects across the Arab region.









Ouael Chouchene, Secretary of State for Energy Transition, Ministry of Industry, Mines & Energy of Tunisia

Prior to his appointment as Secretary of State for Energy Transition in January 2024, Ouael Chouchene spent more than 6 years at the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD), where he was in charge of investments in the energy and natural resources sectors in Tunisia.

He worked closely with the Ministry in charge of Energy on the reforms of the legal and contractual frameworks of the renewable energy programme. He also initiated and supervised a financing and restructuring programme to the public power utility STEG, accompanied by a reform roadmap designed around three main pillars: corporate and climate governance, modernisation of financial management and inclusion in the energy professions. More recently, he led the EBRD's participation in the financing of the Tunisia-Italy power interconnection project (ELMED). Prior to joining the EBRD, he worked in Europe in mergers and acquisitions advisory and financial auditing.

Ouael Chouchene holds a Master's degree in Management from ESCP Business School (Paris) and a Bachelor's degree in Higher Commercial Studies from IHEC Carthage (Tunis).

Yassaa Noureddine, Commissioner for Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency, Algeria's Prime Minister's Office

Dr. Noureddine Yassaa is the Commissioner for Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency at the Prime Minister's Office, in Algeria. He is Professor at University of Science and Technology Houari Boumediene in Algiers and former Director of the Algerian Centre for Renewable Energy Development. A Bureau Member of the UN Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) and Member of Board of Trustees of the Regional Center for Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency (RCREEE).

Dr. Yassaa serves in several national, regional, and international committees on Renewable Energy, Energy Efficiency, Environment, Green Hydrogen, Climate Change, Energy Transition and Sustainable Development. As a former Research Scientist at the Max-Planck Institute in Mainz, Germany, he has been involved in many international research programmes. Dr. Yassaa is author and co-author of more than 80 peer-reviewed international scientific publications, member of editorial boards of several international scientific journals and manager of national and international programmes.









As recognition of his work, Dr. Yassaa has received several national and international awards.

Mahmoud Fathallah, Director of Department of Environments and Meteorological Affairs, League of Arab States

Director of the Department of Environmental Affairs and Meteorology and Head of the Technical Secretariat of the Council of Arab Ministers Responsible for Environmental Affairs at the League of Arab States. He holds a PhD in Economics from Cairo University and is an active member of several economic associations. He has a wide range of academic and applied experience in economic policy having worked in several local and regional institutions including the Ministry of Economy and Foreign Trade in Egypt, the United Arab Emirates University in the United Arab Emirates, the United Nations Development Program, and USAID projects. He is also a visiting assistant professor of economics at the Faculty of Economics and Political Science, Cairo University and has a number of publications, He is co-editor of the Joint Arab Economic Report.

Ahmed Adbelaziz Mohamed Badr, Director-Project Facilitation and Support, International Renewable Energy Agency

Ahmed Badr is the Director of the International Renewable Energy Agency's (IRENA) Project Facilitation and Support division. The division offers members dedicated project implementation support. Mr. Badr joined IRENA in April 2020 and brings more than 30 years of international experience in the field of banking and finance to the Agency.

In his role, Mr. Badr is tasked with leading the development of the division by building strong lines of cooperation with development banks and international financial institutions. He also spearheads IRENA's implementation of the Climate Investment Platform, a multi-stakeholder platform established in partnership with SEforALL, the UNDP and in coordination with the Green Climate Fund, which has the objective to streamline access to climate funding for developing countries and advance the deployment of renewable technologies. He also manages IRENA's ongoing relationship with the Abu Dhabi Fund for Development.

Mr. Badr also leads the execution of the Energy Transition Accelerator Financing Platform (ETAF). ETAF is a multi-stakeholder climate finance solution which aims to accelerate energy transitions by directing at least USD 5.0 billion by 2030 into renewable energy projects in emerging economies.









Prior to joining IRENA, Mr. Badr held several senior operational positions in the field of climate change, renewable energy, energy efficiency, water and infrastructure projects in a number of multinational financial institutions, including the World Bank, European Bank for Reconstruction and Development, European Commission (EuropeAid), and Japan Bank for International Cooperation.

Mr. Badr is a certified infrastructure project manager, with a B.Sc. in Civil Engineering and master's degree in Infrastructure Economics from the Universite de Nantes, France.

Christian Berger, Head of Delegation, The European Union Delegation to Egypt

Before coming to Egypt Christian Berger served as Ambassador and Head of the EU Delegation to Turkey from 2016 to 2020, and Ambassador to Turkmenistan. From 2011 to 2016, he was the Director/Deputy Managing Director for the Middle East and North Africa at the European External Action Service in Brussels; and from 2008 to 2011 EU Representative / Head of Delegation in Jerusalem. From 2006 to 2008 he was Head of the European Commission Crisis Response & Peace-building Unit, and from 2005 to 2006 EU-Representative to the Quartet Special Envoy (James Wolfensohn), working mainly on the Rafah Agreement (Egypt-Gaza border crossing). In 1997 Christian Berger joined the European institutions. At first, he was responsible for relations with Syria, then Political Advisor on Middle East issues. In earlier positions, he served with the OSCE in Vienna and the United Nations in Syria (UNDOF), Gaza and Jerusalem (UNRWA). Christian Berger is an Austrian citizen; he is married with two children and holds degrees in law from the Universities of Vienna and London (LSE).

Tibor Stelbaczky, Principal Adviser – Energy Diplomacy, European External Action Service

Since 2022 September Tibor Stelbaczky is working at the European External Action Service (EEAS) as Principal Adviser on Energy Diplomacy. He is dealing with the external dimension of the EU's energy policy and the implications of the energy transition worldwide.

Before joining the EEAS, Ambassador Stelbaczky was the Permanent Representative of Hungary to the EU in Brussels between 2019 and 2022 and Deputy Permanent Representative of Hungary to the EU between 2015 and 2019.

Graduated in economic sciences and earned a PhD in international relations. His career started at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs as a member of the accession negotiation team at the State Secretariat for EU Integration. Later he was first posted to Brussels in 2004









and served as a Mertens diplomat until 2011, including the first Hungarian EU Presidency in 2011. Then between 2011 and 2014 he was Head of Department at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs dealing with climate, energy and environmental issues, including participation at COP meetings. Before moving again to Brussels, he was posted to Toronto, Canada as an economic and trade counsellor between 2014 and 2015.

Roberta Boniotti (Moderator), Secretary-General, Mediterranean Association of National Agencies for Energy Management

Since 2017 Roberta Boniotti has been the Secretary-General of Association of National Agencies for Energy Management in the Mediterranean Region, the Association of National Agencies for Energy Management in the Mediterranean Region, a key stakeholder of the UfM Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Platform, representing 13 Countries from the Northern and Southern shores of the Mediterranean.

During this period, he participated to set set up DII (Desertec Industrial Initiative) with European companies in Berlin in 2009. With other industrial members, he founded the Cluster Energie Solaire (CES) in June 2017, an non-profit organisation dedicated to promote synergies between members and positioning itself as a partner for ministries in charge to promote RE in Algeria. Since the inception of CES, he headed the board directors of Cluster Energie Solaire. In September 2019, he was appointed as managing director.









In December 2022, the members of CES decided to extent the objectives of the Cluster to add electric vehicles, green hydrogen, etc. and changing the name becoming "Green Energy Cluster Algeria Groupement".
