Introduction

The **2024 UfM Med Youth Lab** is a dynamic skill-building event designed to equip young individuals with essential project development and soft skills through five days of intensive training and collaboration. Over four days, participants will engage in teamwork to develop project proposals centered on thematic clusters, culminating in a final pitch event where they will present their proposals to key UfM stakeholders, aiming to mobilise potential support and resources.

This initiative is organized by the Union for the Mediterranean (UfM), supported by the German Development Cooperation and in collaboration with the Euro-Mediterranean University of Fes (UEMF), the Anna Lindh Foundation, and the European Institute of the Mediterranean.

Objectives

The UfM Med Youth Lab 2024 seeks to:

- Engage ca.70 young individuals (aged 18-29) in skill-building sessions aligned with UfM Youth Agenda calls to action.
- Foster the development of project proposals through teamwork and practical exercises.
- Enhance participants' soft skills to upscale their project ideas.
- Promote dialogue between youth, Civil Society Organisations (CSOs), international and regional organisations, and policy actors.

Thematic Clusters

Participants will work within one of three thematic clusters:

- Green Skills: Focused on developing skills for sustainable green transitions, crucial for addressing climate change and environmental challenges.
- Youth Mobility for Educational and Professional Exchange: Enabling cultural exchange, enhancing employability, and acquiring new skills.
- Youth Engagement in Multistakeholder
 Dialogue: Ensuring youth involvement
 in policy discussions with governments,
 businesses, and civil society.

Final Pitch Event

The closing event of the 2024 UfM Med Youth Lab will serve as a platform for participants to showcase their project proposals they developed during the four days of workshops to a panel of UfM stakeholders, including policymakers, Civil Society Organisations, and representatives from international organizations. Each team will deliver a concise pitch, outlining their project's objectives, impact, and feasibility, followed by a Q&A session. This is not only an opportunity for participants to gain visibility and feedback but also a chance to mobilize support for their initiatives, enhancing the prospects for future collaboration and funding.
