# **Safety in Public Transports**

How to improve safety and security for women and girls in public transport in the Mediterranean region

16 December 2024 — 10:00-13:00 CET — Online





Transport safety and security are inherently gender-sensitive issues. Women's transport behaviour across all modes is significantly shaped by safety concerns, which are more pronounced than those of men. For women, safety is the foremost condition for using public transport. Studies reveal that the majority of women worldwide feel unsafe on public transport, with many reporting incidents of verbal or physical harassment when using it or moving in public spaces. Consequently, women frequently opt for private vehicles, where possible, over walking, cycling, or public transport, prioritizing safety above other considerations.

To address these challenges, a cultural shift is required to design transport systems that fully consider women's needs. Immediate actions are essential to ensure safety and security in public spaces. This includes targeted infrastructure and operational upgrades, public awareness campaigns, comprehensive employee training, improved reporting systems, and a zerotolerance approach to harassment. While substantial changes may demand time and resources, small, practical measures—such as improved lighting can significantly enhance perceptions of safety and security.

Robust, gender-disaggregated data is crucial for accurately assessing the situation and creating evidence-based policies. Technological innovations and new business models also offer promising avenues for improving safety for women, whether as users or workers in the transport sector. Examples include using information and communication

technologies (ICT) to report harassment, generate actionable data, and enhance access to safety-related services and information.

Sharing best practices and fostering collaboration among stakeholders in the public transport sector, including cities and regional authorities, is equally vital. Platforms for dialogue can help accelerate the implementation of effective solutions.

In this context, the UfM Webinar and Workshop will convene prestigious speakers from leading international organizations such as the International Association of Public Transport (UITP), the International Transport Forum (ITF) at the OECD, the International Union of Railways (UIC), and POLIS, the European network of cities and regions for transport innovation, to raise awareness about challenges and potential solutions for safer public transport for women, in particular in the countries of the Mediterranean region.

By integrating global insights with local perspectives, these events seek to share proven strategies, foster cross-sector collaboration, and drive the development of comprehensive safety measures. The ultimate goal is to create a safer public transport environment for all, ensuring equitable and secure mobility for women across the region.
