

Context

Greening higher education is an essential step to equip students and researchers with practical knowledge and skills to address sustainability challenges and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Empowering youth to create a sustainable future is critical for preserving the planet and educating future responsible citizens. Despite the vast knowledge about current environmental challenges, there is still a lack of a holistic, systematic approach to education in this area. Indeed, greening curricula and extracurricular activities, in particular, involves integrating ideas, concepts, and principles from various disciplines.

In 2023, the UfM launched a Public Consultation targeting key Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) and networks across the Euro-Mediterranean region. The aim was to gather input from relevant stakeholders to enhance regional cooperation in the field of higher education. This initiative was part of the preparatory process for a Ministerial Conference focused on establishing a renewed framework for collaboration in this sector. During the consultation, HEIs emphasized the need for a cross-cutting approach to integrating the SDGs and climate-related topics into academic curricula and staff training. They also highlighted the importance of fostering cross-border and interdisciplinary research collaboration to effectively address shared challenges related to sustainability and environmental issues.

In preparation for the upcoming Ministerial Conference, the UfM, in collaboration with UNIMED – the Mediterranean Universities Union – and the University of Girona, is organizing a series of consultations and a dedicated meeting for academic leaders and experts on 26–27 June 2025. These sessions will focus on advancing green education and strengthening capacity for climate action. The discussions will also contribute to the development of an Advocacy Paper supporting the creation of a Euro-Mediterranean University Alliance for Climate Action, and to foster strategic partnerships around core actions such as mandatory sustainability courses, joint master's programmes, researcher mobility, and collaborative research projects. The outcomes of this important gathering are expected to significantly inform the forthcoming UfM Ministerial Declaration on Higher Education and the New Pact for the Mediterranean, both currently in development.

Target audience

Academic leaders, specifically management staff, from Southern and Eastern Mediterranean countries as well as the European Union. Additionally, the event will be attended by scientists and representatives from both regional and global international organizations.

Objectives

- Prepare an advocacy paper for a Euromed University Alliance to be launched at COP30, which could inspire a possible future ministerial declaration on higher education and the new pact for the Mediterranean.
- Propose actionable recommendations for a regional action plan on higher education.
- Map climate-smart and green curricula in the Mediterranean region.
- Showcase best practices in greening higher education.
